PARK START WITH 5-TRY WIN

Welcome to Parknews One swallow does not make a summer, and winning your first practice match against Blackheath certainly does not guarantee a successful season. However this performance certainly gave grounds for some cautious optimism. There were a few key players missing (mainly due to isolating after the dreaded 'ping') but Park still fielded 31 individuals, none of whom looked out of his depth against strong opposition. Of course an exceptional run of injuries can derail any campaign, but there looks to be a strength in depth here that should bode well. The late change of fixture, by the way, came about when Old Albanian contacted the club to say they were pulling out due to COVID among their squad. Blackheath had already been cancelled by Carmarthen Quins, so it made eminent sense to play each other. We're sure no one turning up expecting the original fixture was disappointed!

Quite how Kieran and the coaches will sort out selection after this one will be interesting to see. Your correspondent does not envy them in their task. To give but one example, we started with two experienced, quality and dependable half backs in Jack Gash and Craig Holland, who showed they retained all their ability fitness and enthusiasm. But then we brought on two young new recruits in scrum half Blake Boyland (from Bristol Bears) and fly half Owen Waters (from Loughborough) who were also deeply impressive. Then again, James Brooks came off the bench who made his First XV debut at scrum half last season and was by general consent man-of-the-match. And that is to ignore a couple of other significant names at half-back who weren't available on Saturday. Not the worst problem to have, though.

Further clues will be available this coming Saturday, when we field 'First' and 'Second' teams against their Loughborough equivalents. As we pointed out last week, Loughborough are very much old friends, whom we played regularly in midweek friendlies before League rugby took priority over everything else. We have gained many players from the college over the years, the latest of which is promising fly half Owen Waters. Since Loughborough entered league rugby, making quick progress to National One, we have enjoyed a good few close matches. They were unlucky to be relegated recently but look likely candidates to bounce back after a season in National 2 North. They always get a healthy influx of rugby talent in each year's student intake and are certain to provide a tough challenge.

Admission to both matches is free, so you would be well advised to arrive in time to watch both games (don't worry – the Clubhouse will be open for refreshments).

Before then we were due to visit Blackheath for a return match on Wednesday evening, kicking off at 8:00PM. As this Parknews was being put to bed we heard that match has been called off. Also note that the Rangers match at Esher has switched to Wednesday 25 August at 7:30.

Pre-season match

Whilst one should never take the scores too seriously in these practice matches - and there were several of things that need working on – but there were plenty of things to encourage Park supporters in this performance. Some key players were absent but despite many unfamiliar faces there was a great degree of cohesion and some fine tries.

Blackheath were first on the attack, forcing a 5-metre scrum which Park initially defended well to win a penalty, but the visitors ran back with the ball eventually dotting down to the left of the posts for an early score. The try was converted for 7-0.

While Blackheath possibly shaded things in terms of possession in the early stages, Park looked more dangerous when they had the ball. A good attack up the left saw the ball pass through several hands before Josh Adams showed his pace to burst through for a try out wide on the left. A difficult conversion was missed leaving the score at 7-5.

Park now had the upper hand but Blackheath presented a determined and well-organised defence every time the line was threatened by the home forwards. Park will probably be a tad disappointed at the number of times they drove towards the line but could not quite cross, but eventually they were rewarded when the pack forced their way over for Ollie Dawe to score. Craig Holland added a good conversion for 12-7 at the interval.

Park opened the scoring in the second half with a superb combination move allowing full-back Henry Robinson to make a penetrating run before offloading outside to Adams who again showed his pace to score out wide on the left.

Although Blackheath were now looking slightly out-gunned they refused to go away, and after a rare period of pressure bundled over following a 5-metre scrum. The conversion brought them right back into contention at 17-14.

Another good Park attack saw a panicked defensive clearance parried but the ball crossed the dead ball line before anyone could dive onto it. Park were not to be denied, returned to the attack and again some decisive play by Robinson allowed his winger, this time Curtis Barnes, to power over at pace up the left, converted by Owen Waters for 24-14.

Just to show that was not a fluke, Barnes repeated the feat up the right wing, Waters nailing a difficult conversion for 31-14.

Blackheath managed a consolation try shortly before the end when the defence was caught short of numbers out wide, but Park were well worth the margin of 31-19.

The two teams are due to meet again at Well Hall on Wednesday evening.

The League season

Serious league Rugby begins the following weekend when we make the long trip to Plymouth Albion. Although Albion have struggled in recent seasons, they were beginning to show form before Rugby was cut off by the pandemic. They have recruited wisely and are one of those teams who - particularly in front of a passionate home crowd - tend to play above the sum of their parts. It would be really good to see and hear a Park supporting presence at the match. If you want to get the cheapest rail tickets, don't delay booking! The Albion ground is Brickfields, Damarel Close, Plymouth, PL1 4NE. Plymouth station is roughly 1.5 miles walk to the ground, though it's not the most straightforward of routes and easier to get a cab from the station forecourt. Trains leave London Paddington at 07:00, 08:04, 09:04 and 10:04 and it's about a 3 hours 15 minutes journey. After the match cabs usually rank up on the corner of the road turning left out of the ground, but you might be safer booking one.

You could book to Devonport and switch to a stopping train at Plymouth, and then it's just over half a mile walk if you cut diagonally through the park. However, assuming you want to see a bit of the town, our regulars usually take a cab from the station to the historic Barbican Quarter by Sutton Harbour where there are several historic seafront pubs among the attractions. From there it's a cab to the ground. If you want to be sure of a seat at the ground, Grandstand tickets are on sale now (£19) from http://www.plymouthalbion.com/shop/plymouth-albion-vs-rosslyn-park-4th-september-2021/

First home League match

Our first home League match is on Saturday 11 September against **Leeds Tykes**, kicking off at 3:00pm. Leeds are paradoxically both old and new opponents. The Leeds club were founded at the dawn of professionalism from an amalgamation of two clubs – Headingley and Roundhay – both of whom we played back in the amateur days. As Leeds, they moved to the plush surroundings of the 'other' Headingly ground, sharing with Leeds Rhinos RL and Yorkshire CCC. We played them there a couple of times before they were promoted to the higher echelons and took on the identity Yorkshire

Carnegie.

Unfortunately existence at the higher level proved financially unsustainable and last season they were relegated back to National One and reverted to the identity of Yorkshire Tykes. They have also moved grounds to The Sycamores in Bramhope and are back under the direction of former Welsh International Phil Davies. Phil took the club from National 4 to the Premiership before resigning his position. Although they have lost several players from the Championship squad, Davies' reputation has brought in some decent players and they are bound to be tough, well-organised opposition.

Clubsides

Will Thorogood reports that there is not much Clubside activity, to date, until Friday 3rd September, 8.30pm when the **Nomads** are planning a "friendly"/practice /cough out the cobwebs match against the **4's**. The following week, 11 September, the **4's** have a friendly run out against a **Bank of England XV** on the 4G at 11.30 a.m.

There has been a video meeting about changing some of the scheduled kick off times, dates and venues, but some details are still to be finalized.

Future away matches


Taunton Titans 18 September This is our first visit to Taunton, so there is little local knowledge to offer. The ground is Towergate Stadium, Hyde Lane, Bathpool, Taunton, TA2 8BU. If travelling by train, you will pass the ground on the right (facing forwards) 2.2 miles before pulling into Taunton Station, so that's the distance you'll have to walk unless you get a cab. There is a bus that will get you nearly half way there but it's a convoluted route. Trains leave London Paddington quite frequently for the 90 minute journey, but at time of writing there's quite a disparity between the fares, so do check before you book. There are return trains at 17:44 and 18:26.

The centre of Taunton is a fair walk from the station, and not in the direction of the ground. The good news is that Taunton Rugby Club gets a mention in the Good Beer Guide and does food. Admission is £10 on the gate but Under-16s go free.

Darlington Mowden Park 25 September. Mowden boast the biggest ground of any Rugby club in England in the shape of the all-seater Northern Echo Arena, Neasham Road, DL2 1DL. If travelling by train, you will pass the ground on the right (facing forwards) 1.2 miles before pulling into Darlington Station. If walking to the ground (or taking the 13A or 13B bus from the station) you need to leave the station by the opposite exit to the one taking you into town. Our

regulars usually go into town instead, repairing to the excellent Bar Twenty2 in Conliffe Street and getting a cab to the ground from there. Be warned, though, that cabs are not always easily available so don't leave booking one to the last minute.

There's a regular service to Darlington (00 and 30 past the hour) from London Kings Cross, some cheaper than others so do check before you book. For the return journey there are trains at 17:58 and 18:28, but again be warned about taxis – last time we had one booked for the end of the match it failed to arrive and we had to walk. So don't cut it too fine!
