

PARK MUST TOPPLE TABLE TOPPERS

Welcome to Parknews After two weeks with no action the First XV return to the frav this Saturday to face arguably the toughest task of their season, away to Rams They sit top of the table on 82 points having won 16 of their 18 matches. Only Sale (24-27) at home and Cinderford (37-17) away have lowered their colours so far this season. Last week they hammered Chinnor by 50-31. Park are currently fourth in the table on 67 points, so it is a match we must win if we are to maintain a realistic challenge for the top spot. To make matters worse, they are the only team in the league that we have never beaten! However, behind that last statistic is the fact that on our last two visits to their ground we could and probably should have prevailed. Rams two defeats were on successive Saturdays.

followed the next week by scraping home against Hull (24-19) so they can go through a rough patch like any other club. This Saturday would be an ideal time to record our first win there, and the last half hour of our previous match against Darlington Mowden Park suggested wemmight nbe recapturing the sort of form to do just that. It will be a great help if we can get a large body of supporters there to roar the team on. This one really matters, please make it if you can.

If you've not been before, Rams ground is at Old Bath Road, Sonning, Berkshire RG4 6TQ. Parking at the ground costs £10 but Tony Lawrence passed on that there's a free Park and Ride for those wishing to drive. Parking is at The Piggott School in Twyford Road, Wargrave, RG10 8DS and the shuttle bus runs every 20 minutes from 1.00pm to 2.40pm. Returns from the ground are at 5.00, 5.20, 5.40 and 6.00. By public transport, Reading is the station to head for, either from Paddington or there's a local service from Clapham Junction or Richmond (slower but could be more convenient for some). There is a bus from near the station that runs close to the ground, but finding it is far from easy and the timetable a work of fiction. Especially if there's more than one of you to share the fare it's best to get a cab, but it's a fair distance out of town and cost around £14 each way last time. Our regulars have yet to find a pub as a 'base' in Reading, but you might like to try the Greyfriar (turn right out of the station and it's very close at the bottom of Station Hill). It's a real local with a few decent beers and officially opens at noon, though it's best to give them a period of grace, and there are usually a few cabs available on the hill. If those travelling solo were to meet there you might find a fellow-supporter to share a cab with. You'll get in the ground quicker if you buy your ticket in advance from the Rams website (general admission £15, students £10; car parking £10).

The **Rangers** are also due to be away at **Rams**, and Kick-off would normally be earlier than the Firsts, on the back pitches behind the clubhouse. However, some recent matches have had to be postponed so perhaps check before arriving too early.

At the Rock, the **B XV** are due to play **Old Streetonians** kicking off at 2:00PM and admission is free. The **Fours** and **Nomads** are both due to be away, to **London Kiwis** and **Chobham 2s** respectively. On the **netball** court both our Kingstom League sides are at home at Kingston Uni (Froebel college: Roehampton Lane, entrance next to Clarence Lane, plenty of parking). The **Reds** are first on at 09:30 with a top-of-the table clash against the second-placed **Teddington Thunder**, followed by the never-been-beaten **Blues** at 11:00 against fourth-placed **Focus B**.

Away travel

The First XV have two successive away matches: after Rams this weekend we travel to Cambridge the following Saturday. The ground is Volac Park, Grantchester Road, Cambridge, CB3 9ED. If you are driving take the M11, J12, (A603) to Cambridge. Take 1st right into Grantchester Road (opp. Wolfson College). Ground 300m on right, just past the last house. By train, for Cambridge there is a service from Liverpool Street but the fast service from Kings Cross to Cambridge will be better for most. The ground is nearer the station than it is the town centre, and it's walkable across a fen though in February a cab from outside the station may be preferable. Our regulars tend to go into town and take a cab from there. If you invest in a taxi make sure the driver knows you want the ground in Grantchester Road or you could end up at the University ground. There's a decent clubhouse that does a decent pint and reasonable bar food. The formal pre-match lunch upstairs is already sold out, so if you're not with the presidential party you'll have to forego the company of Lord Archer, who is a keen fan.

Walking Rugby

If you are over 55 and still hanker after playing, we have the answer. Regardless of your standard of play, fitness or gender why not turn up on Monday mornings 10:00-11:30 when you can participate in a social game of walking rugby. 
