

PARK IN BATTLE FOR FOURTH POSITION

Welcome to Parknews It was disappointing to end the home season with a 19-33 defeat by Sale, having said which overall the final score did slightly exaggerate the difference between the two sides. Sale arrived with everything to play for as potential champions and had subsidised a supporters' bus (and issued it's occupants with Sale flags to form a 'guard of honour' when their team took the field. Park certainly did not look as if they had nothing to play for and fought to the end, but errors at crucial moments took their toll. In fact there is still much to play for as Park are in something of a dogfight to secure a creditable finish to the season in fourth place. We are currently level with Plymouth Albion on 28 points and 5 points ahead of Cinderford, whom we play away next Saturday. - though we have a game in hand over both. Clearly Cinderford will be up for a 5 point win to give themselves a chance were we to lose without gaining a point from that match or at Leeds Tykes in our final match. If we were to finish level, we would have identical wins, draws and losses and it would come down to points difference - ours is 92 and Cinderford's 49 so it would need a couple of hefty defeats for them to overtake us. Plymouth are a different proposition, having a positive points difference of 104, so we need to better their points differential in their final match – that is against Championship favourites Cambridge at home, this coming Saturday where they expect to have not far short of a 2000 gate roaring them on. So we need 6 points from our remaining two matches to be sure of fourth place.

We may have beaten Cinderford 46-26 in our first match of the season at the Rock, but they are a different prospect altogether at their own Beavis Memorial Ground. They have only lost one home match all season - 12-17 to Cambridge. They beat Rams 37-17, Sale 27-26 and Plymouth 41-28. Please do come along and support your team. The ground is The Beavis Memorial Ground, Dockham Road, Cinderford, Gloucestershire, GL14 2AQ. By public transport, the train from Paddington to Glouceste is the one to go for, followed by a 30-35 minute bus ride (unless you can afford upwards of £40 for a cab). The bus station at Gloucester is diagonally opposite to the rail station to the right, but allow 10 minutes to get there and locate the correct bay for the bus. According to the timetable on the internet buses leave at 25 and 55 past the hour on Saturdays, but on one occasion ours was running 25 minutes late so don't leave it too late. The bus stops right by the ground, next to the co-op supermarket. Take an important note that the return journey can be a problem; there's a bus that leaves at around the time the match is due to end (check the bus stop timetable when you arrive for the precise minute) but if there is added time you either leave before the end or miss it!. If you miss that one the next bus is an hour later and is not due to reach Gloucester until 18:25, so bear that in mind when booking your return train ticket. If you are looking for sustenance, we've yet to find a decent hostelry in Cinderford, though the clubhouse does food and a decent pint. Our regulars tend to get an early train and stroll into Gloucester for a couple of pints before catching the bus.

If you want your Rugby fix at the Rock this weekend then we have some - of the 13-a-side variety. On Sunday afterrnoon the London Broncos are playing Dewsbury in the fifth round of the Rugby Leaguie Betfred Challenge Cup, kicking off at 3:00PM. Admission is £15 but it's free for Under-16s accompanied by an adult.

The final match of the season is away to Leeds Tykes, who are already relegated but will not want to drop from National One without leaving something to remember them by. If we cannot get a result at Cinderford it could still be a vital match. Your support would be greatly valued. In visiting Leeds Tykes we are breaking new ground: they have moved from the palatial Headingley stadium to groundshare with West Park at the more

homely Sycamores at Bramhope (Leeds LS16 9JR). Leeds is the station to book to, and get in quickly for the cheapest tickets remaining. It's a fair distance from Leeds station to Bramhope, so a cab may be expensive if there aren't a few of you to club together. Bus X84 from Leeds bus station takes 29 minutes, leaving at 03 and 33 past the hour and passes close to the ground. The bus station in Leeds appears to be a 0.7 mile walk from the rail station according to Google maps. This information was taken from the internet and given in good faith, but do check things for yourself.

Rosslyn Park 19 Sale 33

National 1

Park were closer to Sale in terms of overall play than the bare result suggests, but errors presented Sale with at least two of their tries.

The first 15 minutes were pretty tight, but with Park creating perhaps the better chances. A good attack saw Park pressing close to the Sale line only to be undone by a forward pass. A good tactical kick from full-back Henry Robinson took his side to within 10 metres of the line. But all the good work was undone by a simple defensive blunder. Sale cleared with a neat 50-20 for a throw deep in the Park 22 and the defence were clearly unprepared for the quick throw that put centre Fergus Mulchrone through to score completely unmolested. Fly half Tom Curtis missed a difficult conversion but it was 5-0 to Sale on 15 minutes.

It was clear from early on that the home scrum was under pressure, but Park were still more than holding their own in open play. Hooker Charlie Piper put in a terrific tackle to halt a Sale attack in its tracks. Then his pick-and-go set up a terrific Park move that might have been the try of the season but for a forward pass as the line beckoned. Winger Max Trimble nearly scored with a neat chip over the defence but could not quite get to the ball before a defender in the in-goal area. On 32 minutes Park put in a good attack through the forwards, again pressing close to the line and when the ball was passed back to Robinson he skipped in for the try, converted by fly half Luc Smith for 7-5 to Park on 32 minutes.

However, Sale restored their lead only 5 minutes later when Park knocked on in their own 22 and Sale's James Harper caught out the defence, running from there to score, converted by Curtis for a 12-7 lead at the interval.

It took only 5 minutes of the second half for Park to equalise with a great individual try by centre Joe Luca Smith, receiving the ball around half way he sprinted past several defenders to score wide of the posts. Smith went very close with a difficult conversion but the score remained 12-12.

Luca Smith nearly grabbed his second for Park from a good move, only for a cruel bounce to elude his outstretched hands.



Park were under severe pressure at a series of scrums near the Park line, leading to penalties and scrum resets. It probably changed the game when eventually prop Cameron Zeiss earned the referee's disapproval to make it once too many and was sent to the bin on 61 minutes. Park's depleted numbers defended well, though former Park favourite Nev Edwards looked to have scored for Sale but it was ruled out for a forward pass. But on 65 minutes, following a scrum, replacement Mark Tebbutt got over the line, converted by Curtis for 19-12.

Park certainly didn't take it lying down. Trimble very nearly got over for Park, but Sale began to get the upper hand and again their forwards put pressure on the Park line to be awarded a Penalty Try, perhaps a little harshly, for 26-12 on 72 minutes.

Three minutes later the visitors put the match beyond doubt, kicking to the corner and the mauling over for Oli Longmore to claim the try, converted for 33-12.

Park carried on battling in what was now a lost cause and were rewarded for their efforts when a high tackle from Sale led to a pick-up-and go from which skipper Dan Laventure got over, Smith adding the conversion for the final score of 33-19.

Promotion and Relegation.

Things have been thrown slightly into confusion by rumours, probably untrue so we won't make things worse by giving any details here! But there are fears that a club who would be expected to take part in the Championship next season may be unable to do so. Assuming that does not happen, there is a tight battle at the top of the table with **Rams** on 109 points, **Sale** on 108 and **Cambridge**,

with a game in hand over the other two. Rams play away to Esher and Sale at home to Moseley in their final matches away to Plymouth Albion and home to Moseley. Tight, but it's Cambridge's to lose. At the bottom of the Championship table **Richmond** are 4 points ahead of **London Scottish** with two matches remaining, but one scenario if the division ends up a team short would be that no one is relegated.

At the other end of the table, Hull and Leeds Tykes are definitely relegated, with Esher and Taunton fighting to avoid the other place. Esher are currently a point ahead of Taunton. This Saturday both sides are at home: Esher to Rams and Taunton to Leeds Tykes. It's just possible when the dust settles on the Championship farrago that only two clubs may be relegated. There will definitely be three clubs promoted: Blackheath, Leicester Lions and Sedgeley Park. The Leicester side will be new opponents at First XV level, and we should perhaps mention that they have no connection with the other club in that city.
